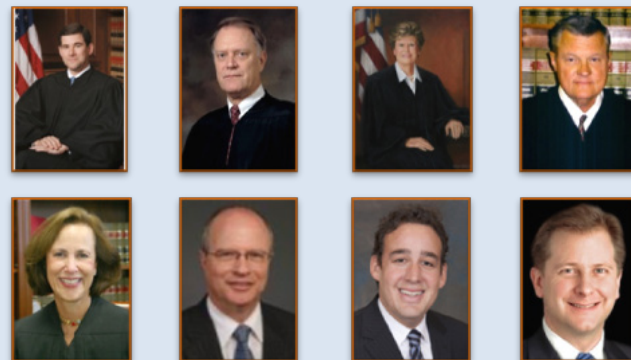

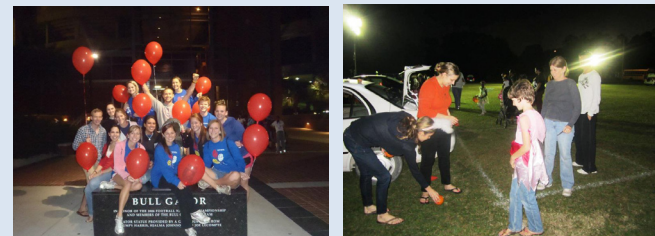
The Florida Law Review had the honor of hosting the following prominent guests to discuss current legal issues and to learn from their experiences:
